2. Proposition 31 — State Budget Process.

AAUW recommends a No Vote

3. Proposition 35 — Human Trafficking.

AAUW has no recommendation. While opposed to human trafficking, this measure has many flaws

4. Proposition 38 — Tax for Education and Early Childhood Programs.

AAUW has no recommendation.

5. Proposition 40 — Referendum on the Citizens Redistricting Commission Senate District Boundaries.

AAUW recommends a Yes Vote.

The books will be used in the classrooms, and will be available for the children to read during silent reading times, and for the teachers to use to read aloud to the children.
