Bits and Pieces

U.S. District Judge Tanya Chutkan ruled in late April that employers have until September 30, 2019, to report two years of pay data by sex, race and ethnicity to the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC). The district court admonished the administration for failing to immediately reinstate this critical equal pay protection, which the court had previously held was unlawfully halted. Today, the EEOC announced that it expects to begin collecting EEO-1 pay data for 2017 and 2018 in mid-July 2019. This data collection, which was halted by the Trump administration in 2017, will be used by the EEOC to better identify trends in pay discrimination.
