Our speaker will be Ruth-Ellen Grimes, Ph.D. who will give a talk entitled: You Can't Be the Candidate: You're not an ____: An unblindfolded woman criminologist's candid profile.

Professor Grimes' observations as a sociologist of law and criminology detail more than four decades of participation in criminological circles as researcher, university professor, department and committee chair, and consultant. She presents the hurdles she encountered and the dynamics of change she perceived through a gendered socio-political lens, embracing theoretical shifts, research topics, and candid commentaries on the networks and back channel of the 'not-so-old girls network. Ruth-Ellen Grimes has published on the constitutionality of the death penalty, labeling theory, historic penitentiary philosophy, as well as architecture and media influences in criminology. She has taught at the University of Toronto, the University of Pennsylvania, the California State university system and the University of California, Riverside.

The event will be on **March 28, 2020** at 11 am at the Arlington Branch Library. How Sexual Harassment Limits Our Livelihoods

New research from AAUW finds that workplace sexual harassment can take a toll on women's physical and mental health and reduce their lifetime earnings. The report is based on an AAUW analysis of Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) data, a review of academic studies on sexual harassment and an exclusive nationwide survey of AAUW members and their networks.

It shows that the experience of sexual harassment is not often one that women can quickly put behind them. Rather, its impact continues to reverberate throughout their lives, increasing their risk of depression, post-traumatic stress disorder and other long-term health problems. And that's not to mention the financial repercussions: In AAUW's survey of 311 women, 38% of women who'd been harassed said it contributed to their decision to leave a job early, and 37% said it disrupted their career advancement. The report includes harrowing stories like this one from Maria, 53: "I was working as an office manager in a small business, and the boss/owner was the one harassing me. There was no one else to report it to. I ended up quitting."

ECONOMIC SECURITY

How the Pay Gap Affects Women in Retirement Women are shortchanged on pay compared to men from the moment they enter the workforce. Sadly, the gap only grows over time, leaving women vulnerable long after they retire. AAUW's most recent update of The Simple Truth research report found that:

- Women collect only about 80% of what men do in Social Security benefits.
- Women's pension income is 76% of men's.
- Women's overall retirement income is 70% of men's.
